
We had a spectacular day when we got **4 new sign ups in Bridport** in just one day! Huge thanks to Ian Bark, Deputy Mayor of Bridport, and Sue Hasell for all their help bringing those businesses on board.

The first business to sign up on this day was **Green Yard Cafe**, a fabulous hidden gem of a cafe just off East Street in Bridport. Thank you Mike!

Our second pledged champion, Aleksandra's Chocolate Cafe on Bridport East Street, makes handmade chocolates and truffles, as well as novelty creations. They source their chocolate from the finest Belgian suppliers, with amazing local dairy creams and other ingredients found through local providers. I am so pleased that Aleksandra's has decided to ensure that they will only use certified sustainable palm oil in all of their food.

Another of the four businesses to sign up on the same day in Bridport is **Market House Inn**, a dog friendly Palmers Brewery pub on West Street. So pleased that they are one of our hospitality businesses!

Fruits of the Earth in Bridport, a wonderful wholefood shop with a large range of mainly unprocessed food and organically produced food much of which is grown locally, was our third business to sign up that day. They use an ethical co-operative wholesaler who double-check things like 'GMO free', sell a lot of loose and bulk food including oats, muesli, pulses, lentils, whole grains, rice, dried fruit and nuts, seeds, teas, coffees, herbs and spices and also have some surprising sauces... We met Matt from **DURO Insight**, a Bournemouth software company who use AI-backed intelligence to provide media monitoring and crisis management tools for not-for-profits, at the **Big Sustainability Expo** in Southampton in October. He was so taken by the narrative of DSPOC and what we are trying to do – raise awareness around certified sustainable palm oil – that he signed up DURO Insight, that very evening.



Urban Garden, our Christmas lunch venue and generally lovely restaurant right in the centre of Bournemouth has also joined DSPOC. I met Katie just before the summer when we played a guessing game to illustrate the different yields of 6 vegetable oils per hectare of land. The last workplace business to sign up this quarter was ourselves! We realised that Efeca hadn't officially signed up to DSPOC, so it was an easy decision to do so. Every time we buy biscuits, cakes or any other food that contains palm oil, we check the labels, but to show how easy it can be, if you buy biscuits for the office, if you buy own brand biscuits from well-known grocery retailers such as Tesco, Aldi, Lidl, Waitrose, Sainsburvs, Morrisons, M&S and Asda, they will only have sustainable palm oil in them. As we have put the policy on our website and the team know what to check for, we are now officially a fully fledged champion!

Another business that has become a fully-fledged champion is SW Coast Refills, an amazing zero waste shop in Weymouth. If you are local and haven't been, definitely pop in as they have all sorts of lovely ideas of Christmas presents as well as soup kits, groceries, home and garden things and lots more! All of our pledged champions are doing so well and making great progress working through all the steps required to become a fullyfledged champion. **The Prince of Wales First School** in Dorchester has become yet another one of our fullyfledged champions – they have checked with their supplier, told their students and parents / carers about the initiative and put their sustainable palm oil policy on their website.
